Situational Analysis (Background of Project):

In 2017 a "ROSC Wall" was used to showcase the cardiac arrest outcomes. The wall was jokingly renamed to Tomorrow Wall, needing no explanation to people outside medical caregivers on what ROSC means. Since the inception the Tomorrow Wall initiative has rapidly been gaining traction, locally we are leveraging the growing recognition of the "Tomorrow Wall" to honor both our dedicated crews and the patients they serve. By highlighting their stories and achievements, we aim to foster a culture of celebration and inspiration within our community. In the Sacramento Valley Area (Placer, Yolo, Colusa, Sacramento Counties) we have identified over 26 cases from January 2024-June 2025. Of patients surviving cardiac arrest with no neurological deficits and returning



home. Each Operation has a whole wall with mounted certificates of field saves to show crews daily their own outcomes

Project Goals:

The goal of the Tomorrow Wall is to both celebrate and re-Circulation) and memorialize it to a saying non-healthcare Tomorrow Wall is symbolic in regards to celebrating favor who return to their families, represents a belief that we ca

Internally we host a biannual event of reuniting the crews with patients to both embrace the efforts of the event and celebrate/fuel the tomorrow; for patients-the direction they change their lives physically, mentally, spiritually or emotionally, for

crews- fueling why a lot of us entered in this industry. "Even when the day is done, the commitment to care continues. Tomorrow, we will answer the call at a moments notice." Planning & Implementation (describe process from the planning phase, including research, through implementation phase. Include the overall length of your project in weeks/months):

In December of 2024, internally we researched valid cases through CARES database and with cooperation of local hospital providers we were able to contact individuals asking their participation in our celebration. Locating the patients was difficult but out of our cases we were able to speak with 3 participants, of which 2 agreed to participate in the celebration. In less than a month we reserved a venue, organized a presentation/award ceremony, organized certificates of celebration for both crews and patients, and supplied a catered lunch. With what started as recognizing crews grew into local LEMSA, governing body participation as well.

Results (Did you achieve your goals? How did you measure results?):

We did not set measurable goals in the beginning but the fuel of the celebration has motivated not only the caregivers celebrated but others to emphasize training, follow up with their Clinical Education teams on outcomes and foster a collaborative environment with partnering agencies to benefit patient outcomes.

Words cannot describe how influential this was for those involved. In one case (pictured below) a gentleman who worked construction with his son was pacing at home at 6am. He collapsed at 0615, his son was called the night before to come in late for the shift that morning. Coincidentally the son took CPR 3 weeks prior to the event date because their company required it, he began doing chest compressions on his father and called 911. We gave the opportunity for the father to pin his son at the celebration. Sometimes realizing why we got into this industry manifests into realizing we should be educating and empowering others to know its not just ambulances that can save lives but it can be those that live in your own home. Out of the crews celebrated in January 2025, they represented over 100 years of experience. They have worked through staffing shortages, COVID, and years of calls where unfortunately some may replay over and over again when trying to sleep. This was time where they can let their guard down and succumb to an unexplainable empowerment of emotions knowing why we clock in everyday matters.
