Situational Analysis (Background of Project):

In late 2024, the leadership team at Medic Ambulance became aware of the need for a fall prevention service for the Solano County area. Medic Ambulance had previously established a nonprofit foundation (the Medic Keep the Beat Foundation) that could be utilized to manage the program. A team was assembled and began meeting on a regular basis to give the program a solid starting foundation. The first client was seen in January 2025 and since then, the program has been off to a running start, seeing over 50 patients and making almost 100 home visits.



#### **Project Goals:**

The goal of the Medic Keep the Beat Foundation's Fall Prevention Program is to provide no cost, fall prevention services to Solano County's seniors and permanently disabled individuals that are at risk of falling.

The team began meeting regularly to discuss how best to accomplish the goal of preventing inhome falls for Solano County senior citizens. Angeline Pierson, OTR/L and Elizabeth Cook, MOTR/L signed on as Occupational Therapist contractors. Angeline and Elizabeth have extensive history in home healthcare and have assisted in managing community programs in the past. Elizabeth handles the initial client intake, ordering supplies and coordinating with the contractor to install the supplies. Angeline visits the clients' homes, determines their abilities, and needs and does a follow up visit after equipment is installed by the contractor. The team worked to secure a reliable, affordable contractor who installs ramps and grab bars in a timely manner. Representatives from Meals on Wheels agreed to help market the program and provide referrals. Most of the clients do not have email addresses or internet access. The team decided to use Tebra, an electronic document solution that will be easy for Occupational Therapists to use while in the patients' homes and will keep the records secure and HIPAA compliant.

#### Results (Did you achieve your goals? How did you measure results?):

Yes, we are achieving our goals and expect to continue this program for a long time. We can measure results using the following data points: 51 clients served; 99 home visits made; 22 ramps installed in homes; 89 pieces of durable medical equipment given and 76 grab bars installed. Referrals to community services including Adult Protective Services, Pets Assisting the Wellbeing of Seniors and the Agency on Aging are provided as needed.

Medic Ambulance strives to provide support to the Solano community. The Annual Budget for the Fall Prevention program for Year 1 is \$255,000, with a Year 2 Projection of \$310,000. Medic Ambulance Service Inc, through a donation from it's Donor Advised fund, full funded the first 2 years of operations. Recently, we also started receiving support from Meals on Wheels. Fundraising events are being planned now and include a banquet dinner and auction for later this year and a golf tournament in 2026. Additionally, we plan to expand our grant writing in 2025 to reach out for further 2026 funding.


## Why it Matters



## Meet Leslie:

Leslie is an 80 year old female who was referred to our program because she was afraid of falling and wanted to be safe and continue her independent in her own home. She was ambulating with a broken walker and was unable to shower safely. Her front door had 4 large steps. To access her laundry room and garage (how she exits the home) there was a large step that was very unsafe and difficult to manage especially while using her walker.

The Medic Keep the Beat Foundation Fall Prevention Program was able to provide her with a free Occupational Therapy safety assessment and modifications to improve her safety. Grab bars, non-slip strips along with a shower chair were placed in her shower. She was given a reacher to use and safely pick items off her floor and aid in dressing to prevent falls. A new walker was provided along with a ramp to safely and easily access her laundry and enter and exit her home Independently and safely using her AD. Leslie was very satisfied with the fall program and now demonstrates increased safety and independence with ADLs and mobility throughout her home.









Angie from the fall program came out to my house and was very helpful and friendly. She was able to give me 5 things to keep me from falling. I got a new walker because mine was broken and was very unsafe, I got a picker upper so I don't have to reach to the floor, I got strips for my shower with grab bars and a shower chair. I also can now go into my laundry room and out of my house using my new ramp. I feel so much safer and more Independent in my home.

## Meet Duane:

Duane is a 65 year old male who lives alone in a single story apartment. He was referred to our Fall Prevention Program due to his long history of falls. He demonstrated weakness and multiple medical problems such as chronic heart failure, diabetes, history of a kidney transplant, and a hip fracture from a fall. He was ambulating with a can however this was becoming more difficult for him due to his poor balance and weakness. His shower was a step over bathtub making it very difficult to shower safely.

The Medic Keep the Beat Foundation Fall Prevention Program was able to provide Duane with a four wheel walker so he can safely ambulate in his home and community and sit when he felt tired or short of breath. In his shower he was provided a chair with a tub rail and a hand held shower hose to make showering safe and easier for himself and his caregiver. A toilet rail was also placed on his toilet for easier toileting and toilet transfers. He was educated on fall prevention, safety and energy conservation during his activities of daily living and functional mobility. With proper education and distribution of durable medical equipment Duane is now safe in his home.





Angie was so professional and polite when she came to my house to ensure that I would be safe in the shower and walking inside and outside of my home. She installed a safety seat in my shower, also a shower head with a wand to make showering safer and easier. She even taught me how to use it! The walker that she provided makes getting around much easier and also has a seat for when I get fatigued. Angie was a real blessing in my time of need and definitely made my life easier.
